Gratitude for the Healing Process

As November comes to a close, I wanted to take a few moments to thank all of our allies for being a continuous support system so that we may continue to do the work that we do to serve survivors of domestic and intimate partner abuse. There have been countless lives changed and thousands of stories to tell. On a daily basis our team of advocates are meeting survivors wherever they are in their journey and empowering all survivors as they navigate their way so they are not alone through their healing process.

As we work with each survivor through their healing process, we know that it does not happen overnight and that it is not linear. This quote by Dele Olanubi is a wonderful reminder about healing, "Wounds don't heal the way you want them to, they heal the way they need to. It takes time for wounds to fade into scars. It takes time for the process of healing to take place. Give yourself that time. Give yourself that grace. Be gentle with your wounds. Be gentle with your heart. You deserve to heal."

Those who are survivors of domestic and intimate partner abuse and survive trauma along their path or those of us who survive trauma along the path must also remember that healing occurs in stages. There is no exact format of what healing is supposed to look like or how long it should take. We do know that we should not compare healing to that of others since every journey is unique.

Recently, a survivor who used our services a few years ago decided that she was in a good place in her journey to pay it forward to others and this is what she said:

"If it wasn't for Turning Point, I can honestly say I would not be alive to tell my story right now. I had lost hope and thought there was no help for me. When I called, the person on the other end of the line understood how dangerous my situation was and brought into shelter. I finally live free from abuse. Living through my situation was not easy and the work to heal was not easy, but it was worth it. The counseling and support that I received helped me tremendously. I am forever thankful for the advocate who answered the phone that day and for all the advocates who worked with me throughout my journey. I have a second chance at life to live again on my own terms."

You never know what someone else is going through or what they've been through. Remember to be gentle and loving with yourself and with others.

We need to understand the history of how systems have failed our families and their children. I am excited to continue the amazing work done at Turning Point. Due to COVID many of the programs and ideas could not be implement. I am excited to be part of the process of rebuilding and expanding our counseling programs for children and teens. This includes working with Communities in Schools to provide support groups and individual counseling at Easton Area High School. Our in-person support groups and events for our children at our Safe House have resumed. Starting on December 15th, we are re-launching our virtual support groups for youth ages 13-18. In addition we will continue to keep fostering our relationships with our current community partners.

With the help of the Outreach team here at Turning Point, our goal is make sure that all children and teens in the Lehigh Valley are aware that these services are available for them. I am excited to continue this amazing work in this community and making sure that children and teenagers are supported and develop healthy relationships.
